PLACE WASTE AND RECYCLING BINS AT THE CURB

Reminder to place waste and recycling bins at the curb and not on the sidewalk or on top of snow bank by 7 a.m. to ensure pick-up by our waste contractor GFL. Bins left on top of snow banks will not be collected.

TAKE CAUTION AROUND LAKES, STREAMS, **RIVERS AND STORMWATER PONDS**

Take caution around local bodies of water such as Fairy Lake, the Holland River and storm water ponds. Use extreme caution and advise your children not to skate, fish, swim or toboggan in these areas. Stormwater ponds may look safe but water flow and levels can fluctuate quickly without warning. Please do not skate on stormwater ponds.

MANDATORY MASKS REQUIREMENTS LIFTED AT FACILITIES

As of March 21, masks are no longer required to enter a Newmarket facility in accordance with the Provincial mandates.
