PREVENT ENCOUNTERS WITH COYOTES

During coyote mating season, coyotes can be more aggressive. Prevent encounters with coyotes by:

- Removing any food attractants, storing all garbage in sealed containers
- Using motion sensing lights around your home
- Picking up after your pet, and keeping them leashed at all times

If you encounter a coyote, stay calm and back away slowly. Never run or turn your back on a coyote.
