### Blue Star

## Handicrafts



- **Pine Cone Bird Feeder**

A natural pinecone bird feeder that is decorative and easy to make. Help a bird survive by keeping a bird feeder going all winter. Hang from a tree outside your house and keep a record of the different birds that come to visit.



- **Yarn Toy**

Make a project from recycled odds and ends such as a yarn toy. Participants will recreate a popular toy from pioneer days by learning to wrap yarn and tie knots. Discuss the difference between this toy and modern toys. Your toy to take home or give to someone as a gift.
