



Vancouver 2010 Olympic Torch Relay *the Relay in Ontario*

By the Numbers

- 21 days
- 43 community celebrations
- 226 communities/places of interest
- 19 Aboriginal communities
- 12,160,282 – provincial population
- 92% of population within one hour's drive of the relay route
- 6,350 – total kilometres through the province
- 900 – total kilometres by torchbearers
- 5,450 – total kilometres by land
- 2,900 – total number of torchbearers involved in this leg of the relay

Site of sailing venue during Montreal 1976 Olympic Games

Days 49/50: Toronto

December 17 and 18, 2009

Provincial capital and Canada's largest city

Days 52/53: Niagara Falls

December 20 and 21, 2009

One of Canada's natural wonders

Day 53: Six Nations of the Grand River

December 21, 2009

One of the largest Aboriginal communities in Canada



Day 55: Point Pelee
December 23, 2009
National Park, Canada's southernmost point

Days 56 and 59: London
December 24 and 27, 2009
The Forest City, home to the University of Western Ontario

Day 61: Blue Mountain
December 29, 2009
